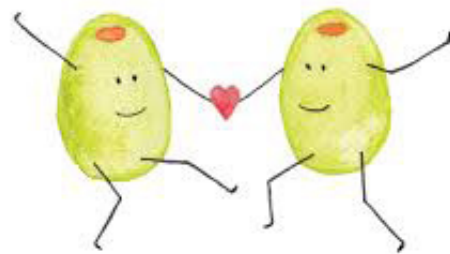

ARTEMISIA, A Film View of an Early Female Artist

Artemisia Gentileschi, (1593-c.1656), now recognized as one of the great Italian Baroque artists, faced a society that considered women as the property of male relatives and excluded them from artistic

careers. Artemisia, a 1997 biopic by French director Agnes Merlet, highlights difficulties faced by female artists in the 17th century, but it also controversially omits reference to the notorious rape and forced marriage of the artist.

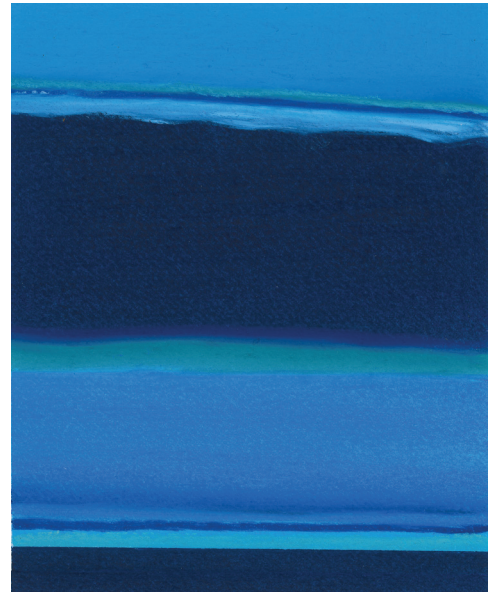

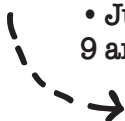

Beginning Knitting

This 4-week class is for anyone who's never knit before or those of you who haven't knit in a long time and would like a refresher. You will learn how to cast on and bind off, how to do the knit and purl stitch, how to read patterns and how to back out of your mistakes. At the end of this class, you will have knit your very own scarf and acquired the basic skills needed to move ahead with more advanced projects.

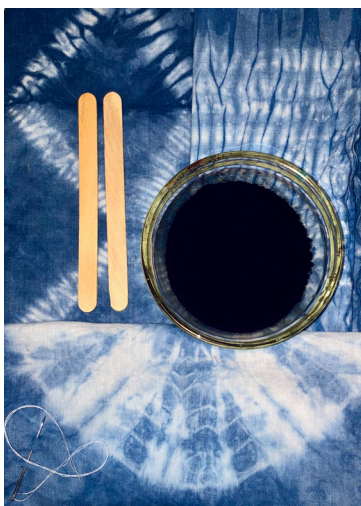

This 3-week class is a great next step for grads of the Beginning Knitting class or those of you who already know the basics of knitting and want to learn a few new skills. You will learn how to knit in the round using circular and double point needles, how to shape your knitting using decreases & how to make those complicated looking cables!

Worsted Weight Socks

Materials: 268 yds worsted weight wool, set of four US 6/4.0 mm dpns, stitch markers, darning needle, + Laule'a pattern by cabin four which can be downloaded here: <http://www.ravelry.com/patterns/library/laulea>

This 4-week class is designed to help first time sock knitters understand the basics of top down sock knitting. We will be working with worsted weight yarn which makes a wonderfully warm house or boot sock & works up quicker and easier than traditional sock weight or fingering weight yarn. You will learn how to follow a basic top down sock pattern which includes picking up stitches, turning a heel, and how to graft a toe seam using Kitchener Stitch!
